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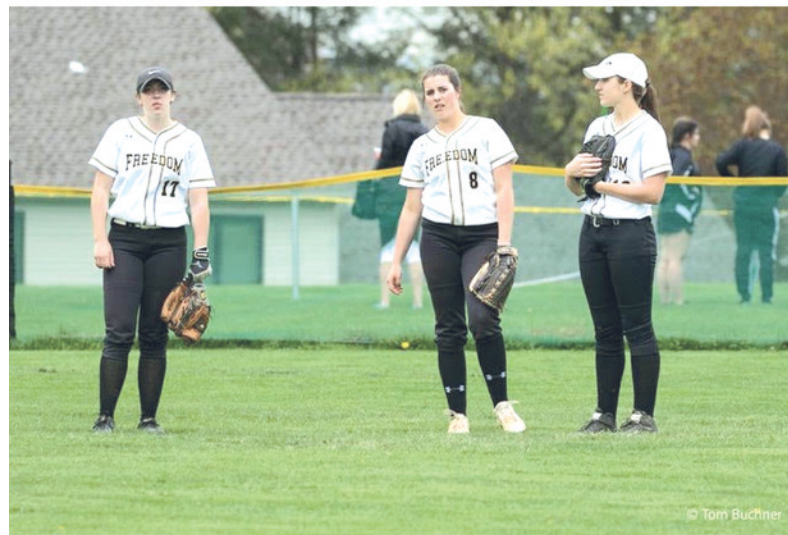
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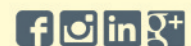

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PATRIOTS BASEBALL LOOKS TO CONTINUE RUN OF SUCCESS



Up to this point, the Freedom Patriots baseball team has had quite a bit of recent success, a trend they would like to continue as they now head into the 2018 season with a good amount of upperclassmen talent taking charge. Last season, the team went 16-6 (playoffs included. 16-4 in the regular season), even starting off with a 7-0 record, but their season came to a halt when they were met with two first round exits in both the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference playoffs and District XI playoffs. In 2016, the Patriots won the EPC championship, but were ousted in their first playoff game in the District XI tournament.

Due to all this recent success, Freedom head coach Nick D'Amico is feeling very confident about his team going into the upcoming season. "I feel we will be able to compete with the rest of the league and will have to do so with great pitching and defense," coach D'Amico said. He emphasized those two points repeatedly (pitching and defense) as keys to being successful this season. The Patriots averaged four runs allowed per game, a total the team is most certainly looking to focus on trimming down in 2018.

D'Amico will look to his group of guys as a whole to step up. Returning to the varsity level, he's looking for Senior OF-P Alec Huertas, Senior 3B-P Tim Healy, Senior 2B Jonah Mateo, Senior 1B-OF-P David Smith, and Senior SS-P Griffin Connelly. New to varsity this spring, Senior Andrew Knerr, Junior Adam Throne, Junior Derek Bast, Senior Echua Caban, Junior JaRay Cotto, Junior Joey Stofanak, Junior Dylann Paar, Junior Sandy Hernandez, Junior Spencer LaRiviere will be looked at as more key contributors he's looking to help guide the team into success.

The team lost five starters from last year in Evan Callahan, Tyler Cooper, Jake Petro, Teddy Liadis, and Tommy Bonilla. As for the offense, once again they are going to be looked upon to make another big splash. When Freedom didn't exactly have great pitching or defense, the offense stepped up in games such as their 14-9 victory over Hazleton, their 10-6 win over Wilson Area High School, and their 17-6 rout over Dieruff. The Patriots shouldn't have any problem with that, averaging nearly seven runs per game last year, a staggering total.

For a team like Freedom, the goals remain the same year in and year out. "We go into the season with the goal of improving upon last year's season and look to compete for league and district championships," D'Amico said. This team is anxious to make some noise in the postseason after last year's late season disappointment. In 2018, it looks as though the Freedom Patriots baseball team is coming into a more complete form and appears poised to make a deep postseason run if they can garner the right amount of drive and leadership to get there, which doesn't look like it should be much of a problem at all. Their season kicks off on March 28 with an away tilt at William Allen.

The team will need a quick start and win games early in the season to do that, having gone 2-8 in their first ten games of last season.

Overall though, what are the expectations with the Lady Patriots softball team? "We want to qualify for playoffs and see what happens from there," Borger said. All three components of the team, pitching, offense and defense stepping up will be instrumental in doing that.

Regardless of the result, win or lose, coach Borger says her team is "going to have fun playing the game." In the midst of a swift rebuild, the Freedom girls softball team is going to be a very fun and intriguing team to keep track of this upcoming spring sports season when the cold clears and the grass gets greener. For the Freedom softball team, they hope that the grass is indeed greener, and things are looking up for this squad.

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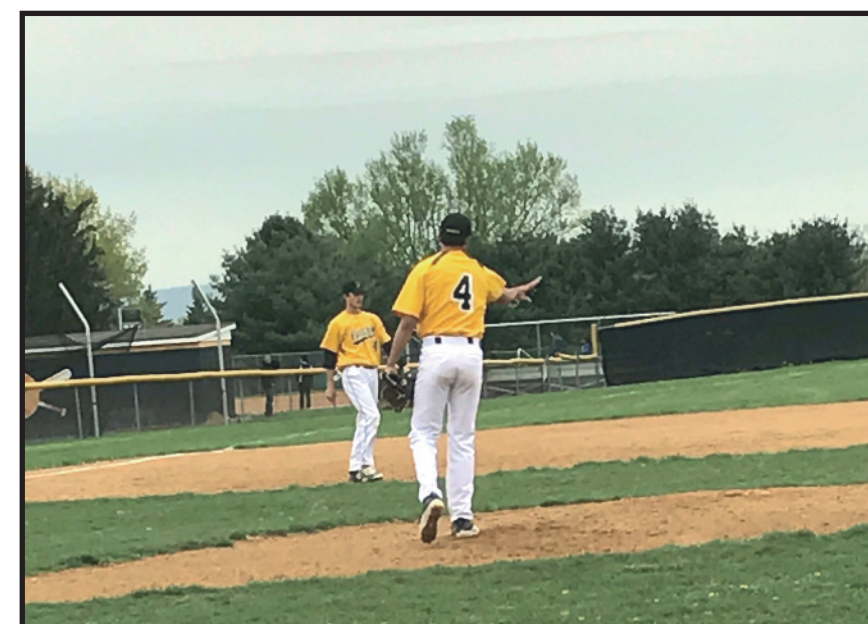

‘THE BAYOU’: SOUTHERN COMFORT IN THE LEHIGH VALLEY



The overall atmosphere of ‘The Bayou’ is very comforting. The same way a bayou makes home for many different crustaceans in Louisiana and the south, this restaurant is a home for enthusiastic regulars pouring in for ‘Happy Hour’ Monday-Friday or flocking the outdoor seating as the sun starts to peak it’s head back out for the warmer months. With an intelligent, detail-oriented Mo Taylor at the head of the business, this restaurant is a solid establishment in the Valley, representing customer care and an enthusiasm for great food. As successful as the restaurant has become, it was a bit of a risk for Mo and the other members of his team to take, coming from a background of purely ‘sports bar’ type dining spots.

“The first thing we wanted to do was, kind of, separate ourselves from what we were known for,” Mo tells me, as I sit across from him in his friendly, packed upstairs office. “Originally, we were going to do a generic name that couldn’t be deemed southern or Italian, or, this or that. [But] we were like ‘nope, let’s go all the way, let’s take the southern thing and run with it.’”

And, run with it, they have. With another Bayou now open in Easton, it’s safe to say the risk was one worth taking. One could come to realize this simply by the flock of individuals that come into the place, but there is more evidence of the feat. Last year, the restaurant was named one of the ‘Hot 100 Restaurants in the Country’ by OpenTable - a phone application that runs nationwide giving users the ability to book reservations without having to make a phone call. This was something that was accomplished by the combination of great food and an atmosphere open to families and people of all ages and walks of life.

“We really set out to try and make our guests feel at home when they come here. We like to, you know, take the edge off,” Mo continues with a genuine tone in his voice. “We serve top quality cocktails and foods- we put a lot of effort into it, but we don’t want to do it in a pretentious way. We want people to feel like they can come in and relax in jeans and a t-shirt or a three piece suit. We [really] have a great family atmosphere here.”



In our short time talking together, the chef comes breezing through the upstairs doorway with two bowls of freshly spiced and cooked beef. Everyone in the upstairs office begins sampling the foods and giving their distinct opinions on the flavors, spices and consistencies of the food - truly paying attention to every finite detail. I’m allowed to sample both and think that they are both amazing, but you can tell the professionalism in these food-loving individuals by their decision making process on which meat is truly better. As they come to a general consensus, all I can think of is the fact that I would have been completely satisfied with either choice and smile a bit in admiration of their detail-oriented process. It’s something you don’t usually see as a regular, dining customer but is, seemingly, what is able to take a restaurant from a regular place to eat to one of the hottest in the country!

With spring and summer (almost) right around the corner, there is an excitement in the air. The outdoor patios are about to open, the summer drinks are about to be crisp and fulfilling to the taste buds and the buzz of weekend escapism underneath the sun and warm stars will be underway.

So, whether you are a regular and love the restaurant or have yet to check it out, be sure to stop on by this upcoming season and find a comforting home in ‘The Bayou!’

March is Brain Injury Awareness Month OVERCOMING A BRAIN INJURY

People often tell me how strong I am, how courageous I am. I think to myself that I'm really not. Years ago I wanted to stop fighting; I wanted to give up; I wanted to kill myself. I didn't because I had a family that loved me; they were the strong ones. In January of 2005, my life was amazing. I was a junior in high school coming right off of a state medal in track and field and I was halfway into my basketball season for Tamaqua High. One hit to my head changed my life forever. Everything was ripped right out of my hands. The ability to go back to school and the opportunity to win a D1 scholarship for track was now gone. I spent years with disabling migraines and I needed help walking from point A to point B.

I went from being this all-star athlete to the girl that people made fun of because I had a brain injury. I no longer understood life. Why did this happen to me? I was in excruciating pain day in and day out. I became a guinea pig to doctors. They didn't know how to treat me or what was even wrong with me other than "post concussive syndrome". They prescribed me pills, lots and lots of pills.

Some medications made me stutter and slur my words while others made me a complete zombie. I had lost all faith in doctors. I had one doctor tell me, "You're going to have migraines for the rest of your life, we'll just teach you how to deal with it". I wanted to give up. The pain was so bad that I wanted to fall asleep and never wake up. I often thought about how I could kill myself. Fast forward to 12 years later, I'm 29 and I'm a full-time student at Temple University majoring in journalism with a sports broadcast focus.

I graduate this December and I couldn't feel more blessed. Isn't that amazing!? But how did I get here? I started fighting back. I persevered. My depression and anxiety were so bad, that I grew tired of it. I started researching holistic approaches for treatments and I leaned on my family. My brain injury gave me a voice, and I slowly started to find my purpose in life. I shared my story online, at conferences, at clinics, and even for the government. I wanted to protect youth athletes. I find happiness when people from all over the world reach out to me and ask for help.

They're searching for hope, and I can give them that. I never gave up. I thought I was weak, and technically, I wanted to give up many times...but I didn't. I started finding the positives in my life instead of focusing on the negatives. I had an amazing family and a bright future that I wanted to start writing. The last piece of my crazy puzzle was solved when I found my miracle doctor in Rhode Island, Dr. Pedro. He diagnosed me properly, and treated me properly, and in less than two months, he cured me. Now, I really had no excuses.

I was normal again! I made up excuses to not go back to school like, I'm 25 and I can't afford it. After I realized those were just excuses, I applied for FAFSA and the rest is history. I still struggle in school to this day. I get easily overwhelmed and I still have some breakdowns, but every time I do, I realize how far I've come. I am strong! I can do this! I am healthy and happy and that is what life truly is about. So when you're struggling, keep fighting and never give up. If you wrestle with suicidal thoughts, don't do it, because there is someone in this world that cares about you, including strangers like me. Find a purpose in life and a reason to keep fighting. NEVER GIVE UP, because I didn't and trust me when I say, life will get easier.

It is a faith building experience to read about Daniel's prophecies of nations, Daniel 9:24-27; David's prophecy of crucifixion before it was invented, Psalm 22:16, and the prophecy of a king named Josiah who would dig up and burn the bones of false prophets on the altar of king Jeroboam, I Kings 13:2, 2 Kings 23:15-18, and over 300 prophecies fulfilled by Christ (Search "Godandscience.org/Prophecies of Jesus").

As amazing as it is to look back in history and see the accuracy of the Bible, it is even more astounding to look at events in our lifetime that confirm the Bible is true. When talking to a skeptic – family, friend, or co-worker – what do you say to them? Ask them to consider the single greatest proof that the Bible is true – the greatest fulfillment of prophecy in our lifetime is the rebirth of the nation of Israel. Jesus predicted the destruction of Jerusalem which was fulfilled in 70 AD and documented in the Arch of Titus – just a few blocks from the Roman Colosseum. The Bible predicted that the Jewish people be scattered around the world, Deuteronomy 28:64, "And the Lord shall scatter thee among all people, from one end of the earth even unto the other." But it also predicts that Israel will be Re-gathered and the Jews will return to their homeland, Israel. Ezekiel 38:8, "After many days thou shalt be visited: *in the latter years thou shalt come into the land that is brought back from the sword, and is gathered out of many people....*"

"The Greatest Fulfillment of Prophecy in our Lifetime – Israel!"

There are over 1,500 prophecies about the second coming of Jesus in the Bible. But one thing is clear – the Jewish people MUST return to the land before the coming of Christ.

Old Testament prophets Jeremiah and Ezekiel both predicted the return of the Jewish people to their land after being scattered around the world – Ezekiel 36:24, 37:12, 14, Jeremiah 30:11; 31:10.

In one generation the Jewish people went from having no homeland to being a recognized nation. In 1948, when Israel took its place among the nations of the world again for the first time in nearly 2000 years, students of prophecy recognized the fulfillment of the primary sign that the end of the age was upon us. Many Bible scholars view the rebirth of Israel as the budding of the fig tree, Matthew 24:32-33. Others see the retaking of Jerusalem in 1967 as the fulfillment of this event. Most musical lovers are familiar with the "old spiritual" called Dry Bones. This song sets to music the prediction from Ezekiel 37 picturing the rebirth of the nation of Israel as a valley of dry bones that becomes a mighty army. The fulfillment of this prediction is found in the Jewish people returning to their land in our lifetime.

We live in exciting days! We are witnesses to the fulfillment of prophecies made more than 2,000 years ago. We can understand that the current crisis in the Middle East absolutely fits a biblical scenario of the last days. A leader will rise out of the European Union to broker a peace treaty between the Jews and the Arabs "in the last days" (Daniel 9:27). This "world peace" does not last very long. Jesus predicted a 3 ½ year period of "great tribulation" on the earth, (Matthew 24:21) before His return to the earth to set up His one thousand year reign upon the earth, Revelation 20:4,

Yes, I know the Bible is true. The proof is found in history, prophecy, archaeology, and even in science. But the most important truth found in the Bible is the subject of your eternal destiny. Everyone has a living soul that will live *somewhere forever!* God gave us an accurate record of His dealings with people for one major purpose – to love us to Himself.

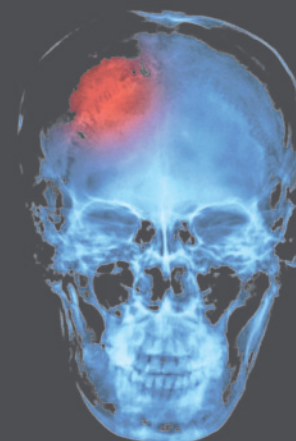
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ONE SUCCESS SECRET YOU REALLY NEED

I made a big mistake when I was a young pastor. Amy and I were speaking at a church near St. Louis. The services were unusually blessed by God and the people were happily responsive. Every night the church was full, and we were continually adding seats.

I was presenting a series on how to have a growing relationship with Jesus Christ. People of all ages were represented, and I was especially excited about the large number of teenagers and young adults who attended. Midway through the week I was stopped by an older woman. She asked if I had audio recordings of my seminars and I said no. She then asked if she could order a set.

I had never sold audios at an event and her question led me to a decision. I spoke with her the next night and told her that I would be happy to take an order and send her the audios when they were completed. She was very appreciative and said she would tell her friends at the church to order as well.

There was so much interest in the audios that we had to set up a table in the hallway to receive all the orders. People were happy and excited and eagerly paid me for the future recordings and even added postage. Amy and I collected the orders, finished the meeting and left for our next engagement. That was in March. We had a packed schedule and I went from conference to conference for several months. While I was traveling and speaking I forgot about the orders I had taken.

Finally, in August we were taking a quick summer break at the home of Amy's parents on the Jersey Shore. The beach was beautiful, the weather was spectacular, and the Italian food was amazing. We had one week to relax before we went to our next meeting. One morning I received a message to return a call. I did not recognize the number and called, not knowing the identity of the caller. The other person was the sweet, elderly woman who had first asked for audio recordings of my talks at her church in March.

When I realized who she was I remembered my promise to send the audios six months earlier. I apologized and told her that I would send her the audios as soon as I could have them recorded. She was very quiet then said that she no longer had a need for them. She explained that she had ordered them in March, believing that they would spiritually comfort her son who was in the last stages of cancer. She said she had told him about my messages and then waited to give them to him, but he died less than two months after my meeting in her church.

She had been deeply hurt by my failure to fulfill my commitment. After I apologized again and asked her forgiveness, I disconnected. I went into our bedroom and asked for God's forgiveness as well. What caused my failure? I was unorganized and busy. I knew I had promised the audios to those people (who had paid me) but continually procrastinated. Whenever I remembered the orders I would tell myself that I was too busy, or too tired, and that I still had ample time to finish the project, but I never did.

I refunded all the money. I went home, recorded the audios and sent them as well. And I have never forgotten the lesson of that failure. When you make a commitment you keep it, I have only missed two speaking engagements for the past 30 years. Twice I was stranded by different ice storms and could not travel to my locations. I have driven all night, bought airline tickets with my own money, changed clothes in hotel restrooms, sometimes arrived at an event exhausted (I once fell asleep on the stage while I was being introduced to speak,) but I have fulfilled every commitment (except for the two ice storms.)

When my daughter Allison was in Law School she was elected to the student Bar Association. She was responsible for scheduling social events for students and their families. To plan the events, she needed reservations. She said she was always astonished by how many law students would make reservations and not come. Many would personally promise to attend and not show up.

If you are a man or woman who fulfills your promises and keeps your commitments, you will stand out in your generation. Do you want to know one simple secret of success in life that always works? Keep your word, Keep your commitments, To your wife or husband, To your children, To your co-workers, To your friends and neighbors, To God, and Keep your word.

The Bible says in Deuteronomy 23: 21, "If you make a vow to the Lord, do not be slow to pay it..."

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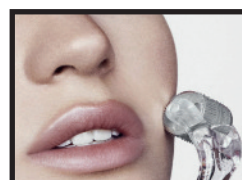
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
